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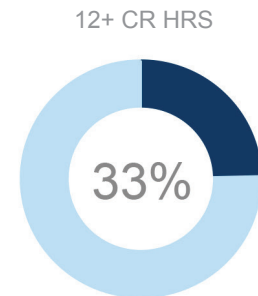
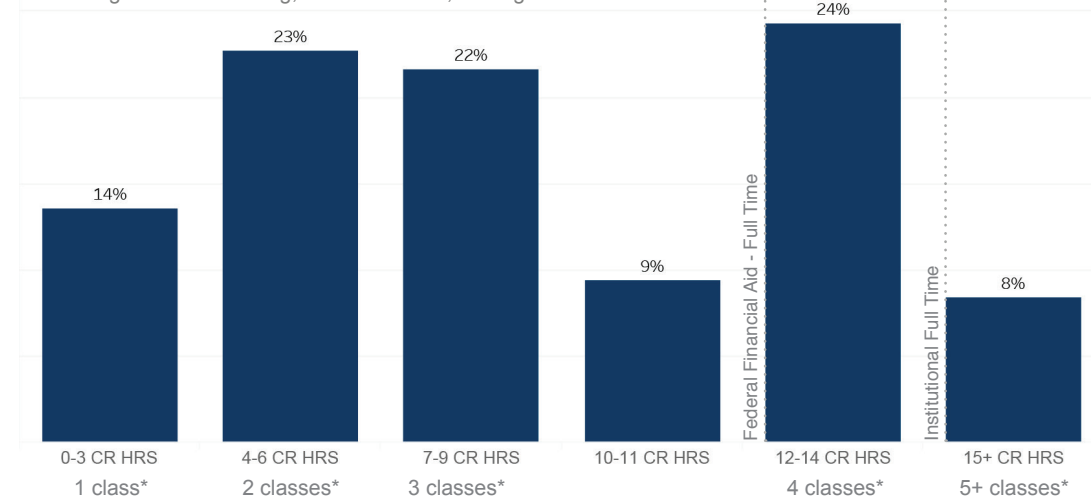


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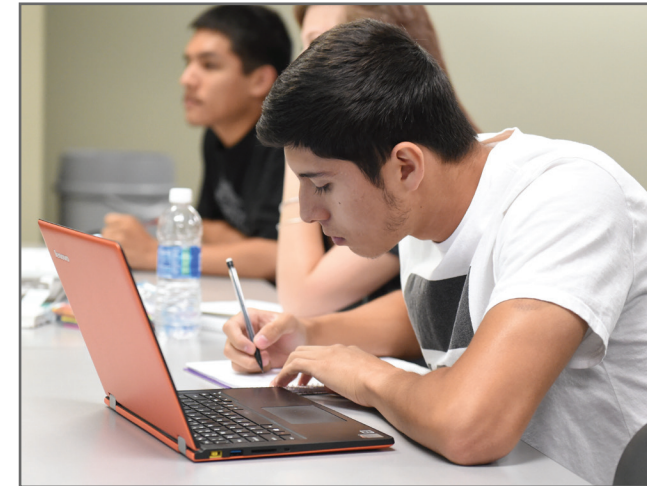
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## Credit Load Distribution

Percentage of credit bearing, non-concurrent, undergraduate students.

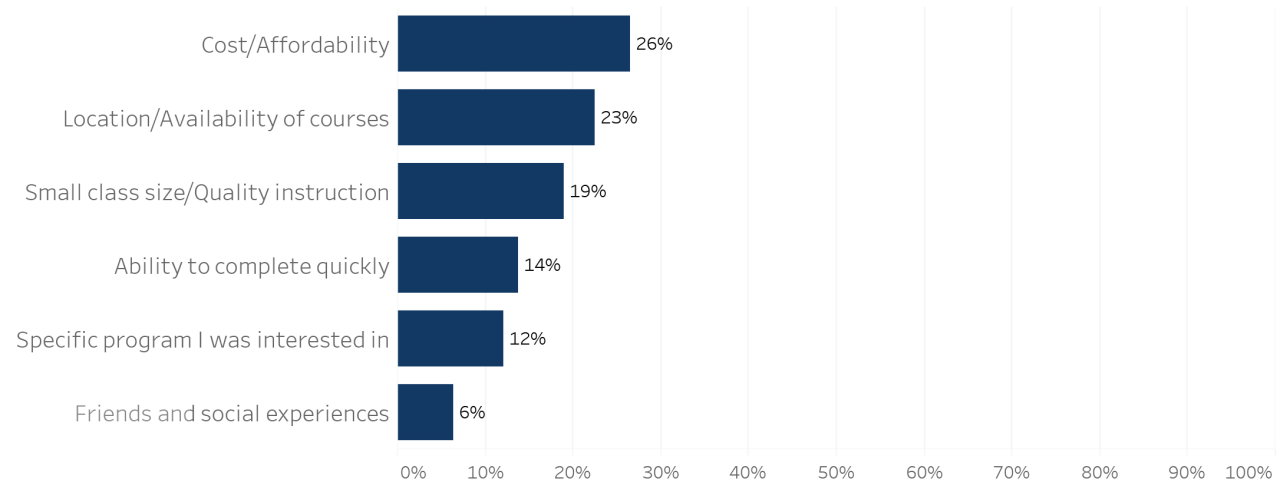

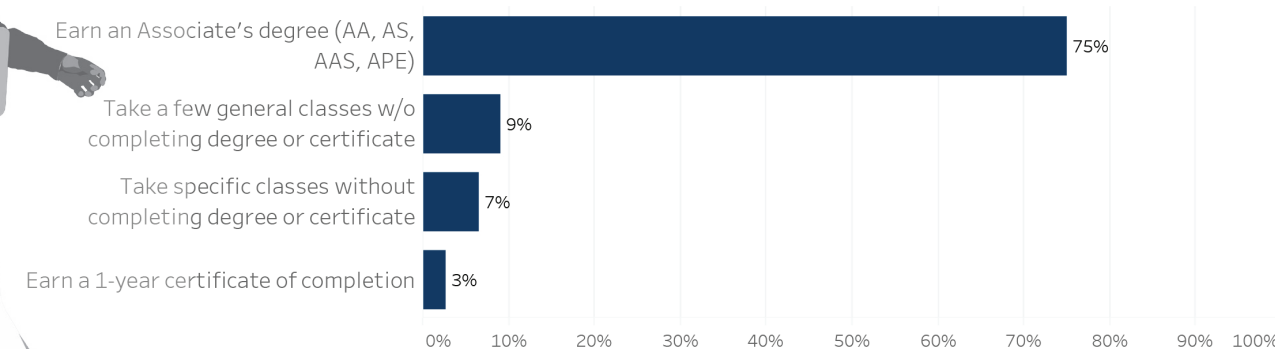
## Why Students Choose SLCC

Percent of students who rated the following elements as the biggest benefit of attending SLCC; New Students Survey Fall 2016

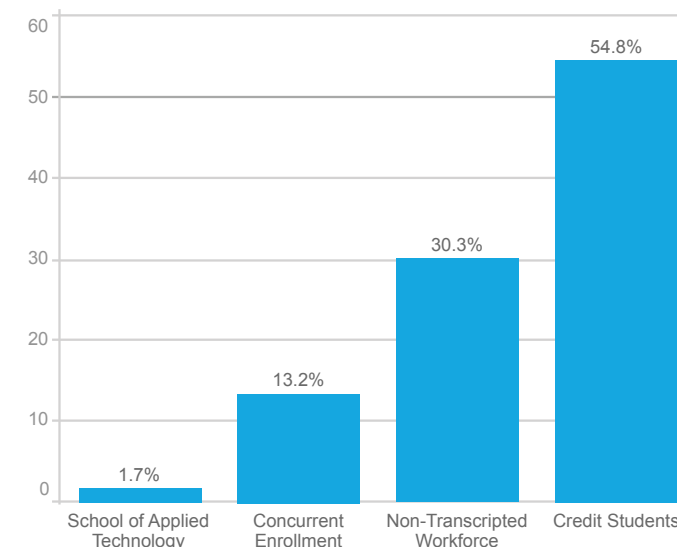


## Primary Objective in Attending SLCC

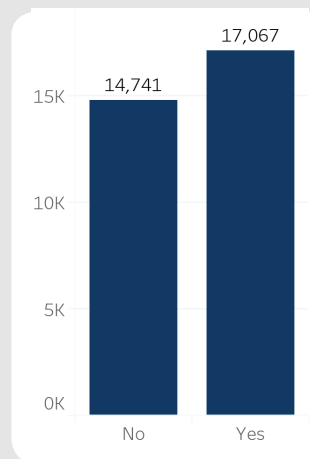

Neither parent achieved a 4-year degree

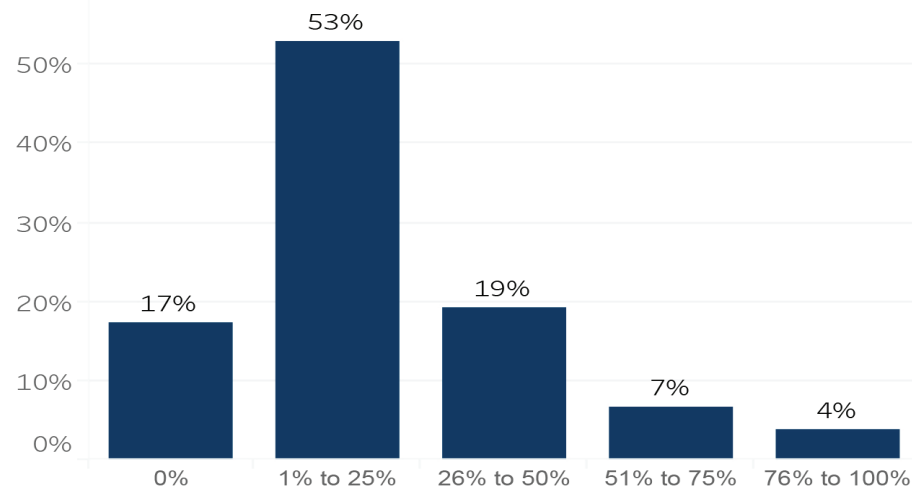

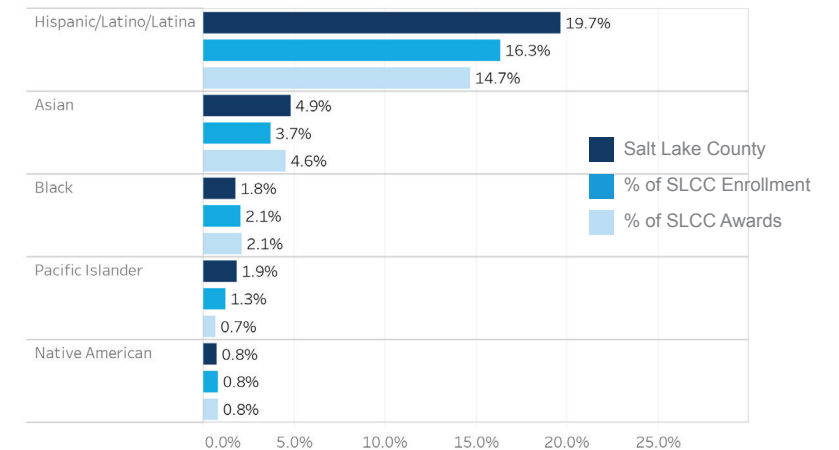

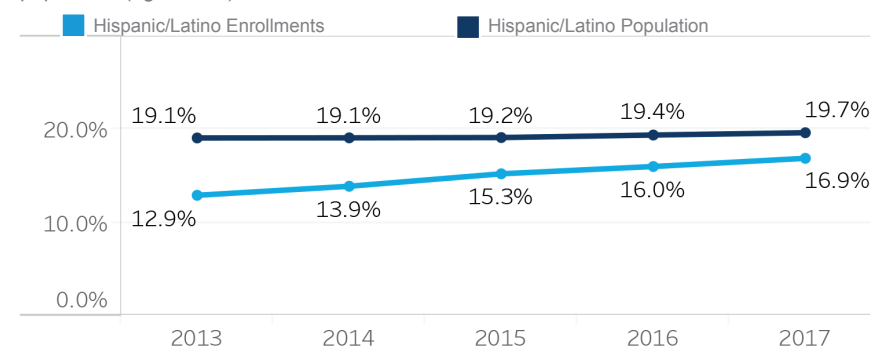
## Participation Rates by Race/Ethnicity

Enrollment at SLCC compared to the percentage of SL County college-aged population; 2016-17.\*



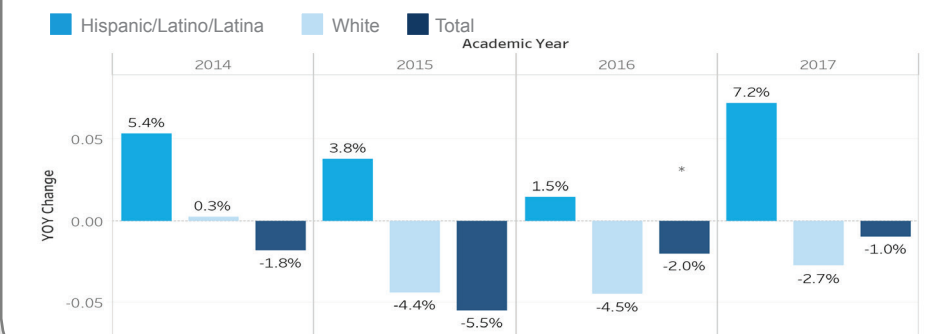
## Hispanic/Latino Enrollments

Percent Growth/Decline Academic Year over Academic Year

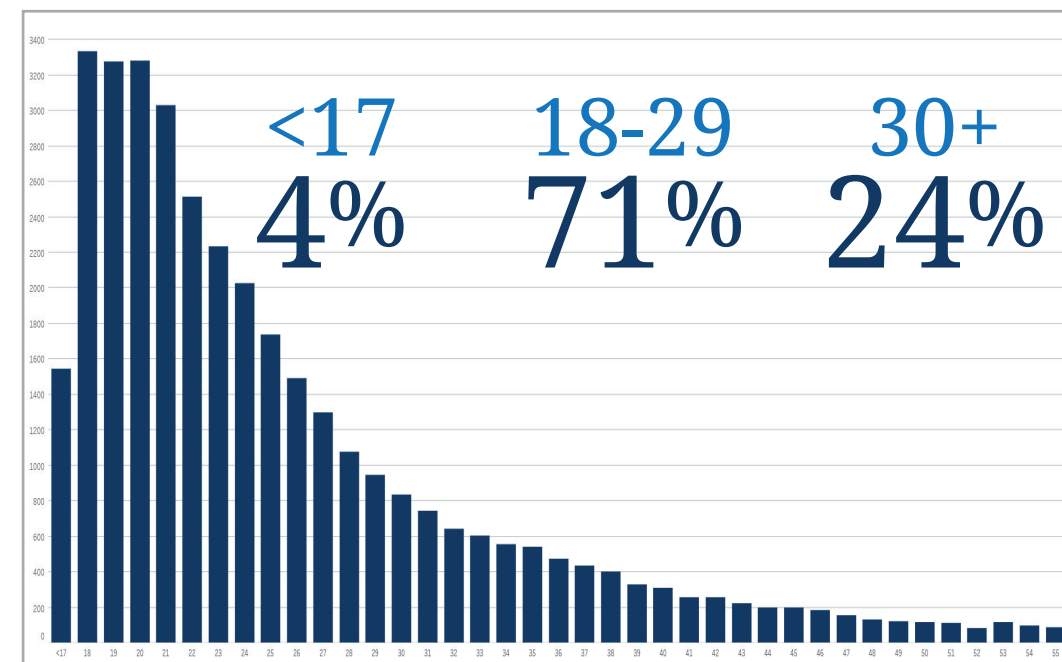
