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INTRODUCTION


The purpose of the fact book is to provide useful information about Salt Lake Community College. Where possible, several years of historical data have been presented to provide perspective and to show trends.

FTE ENROLLMENT BY COST CODE SUMMER QUARTER









ZIP CODES WITH 50 OR MORE STUDENTS





VETERANS CURRENTLY ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE BENEFITS BY PERCENT Fall Headcount








CAPITAL FACILITIES PROFILE ALL CAMPUS LOCATIONS GROSS SQUARE FEET





EDUCATION & GENERAL REVENUE SOURCES - FY 1989-90


EDUCATION & GENERAL EXPENDITURES - FY 1989-90


