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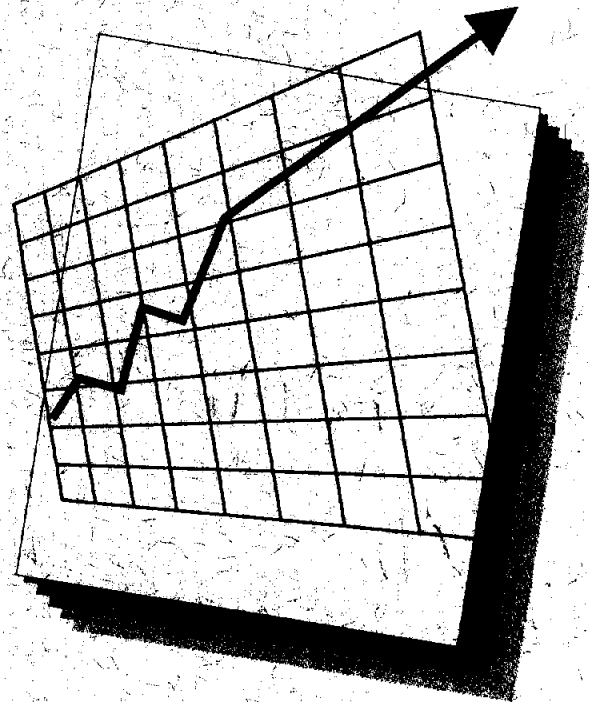

AFTE Fall FTE Fall Headcount Fall HC including Skills Center

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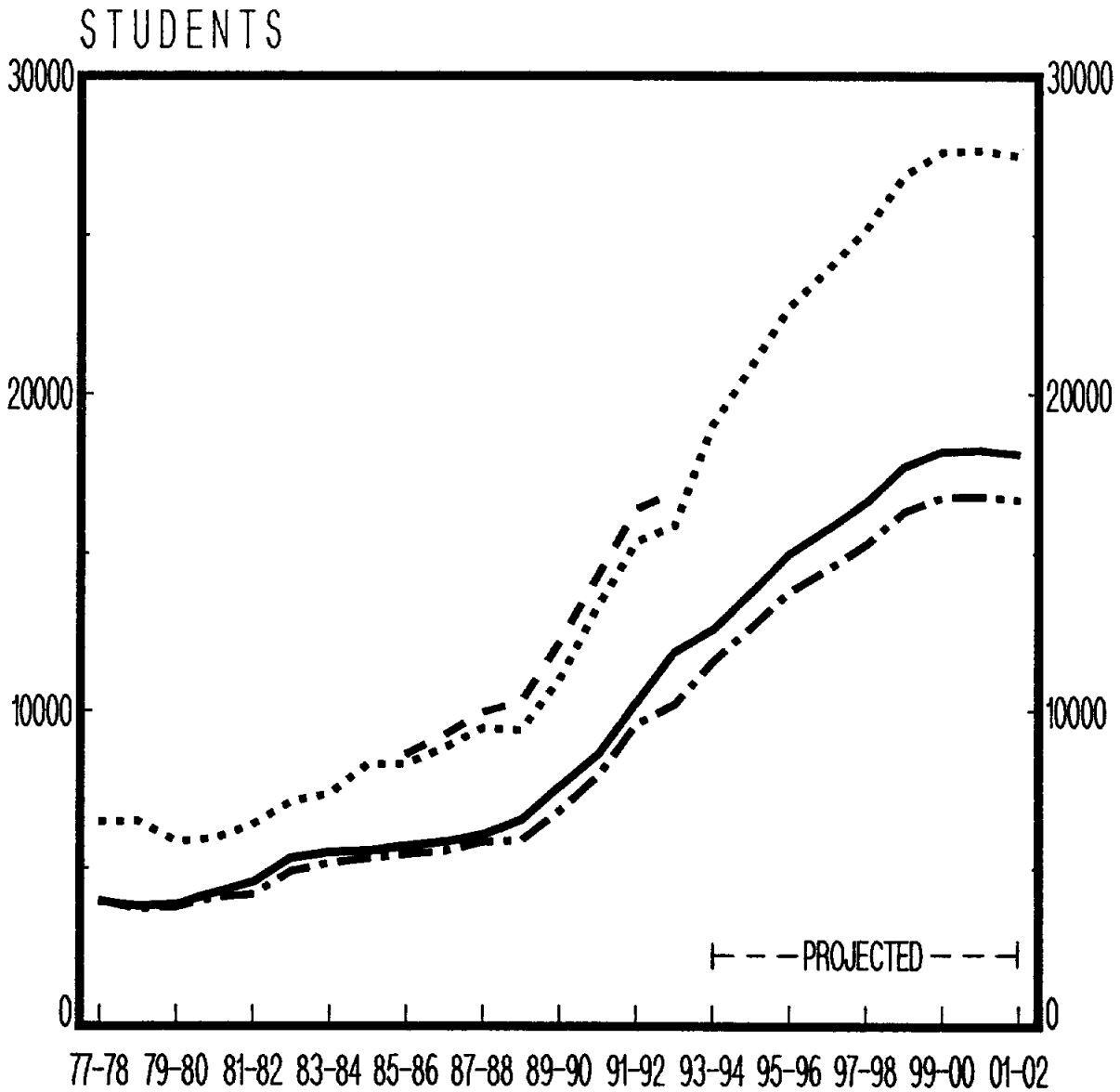

NUMBER OF FTE STUDENTS

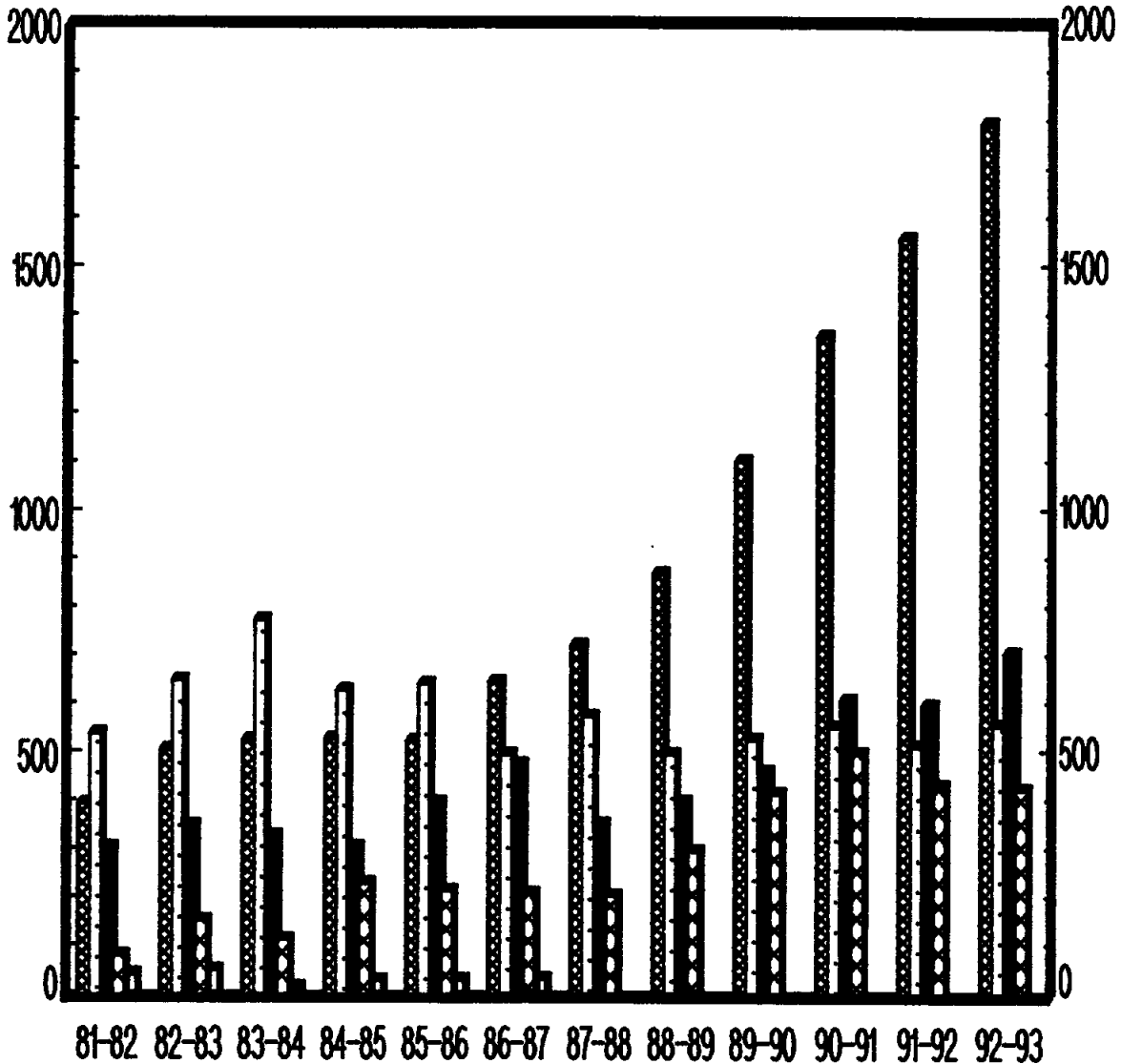

HUMANITIES & SCI ED BUSINESS & TECH OCCUPATIONAL ED CONTINUING & COMM ED OTHER

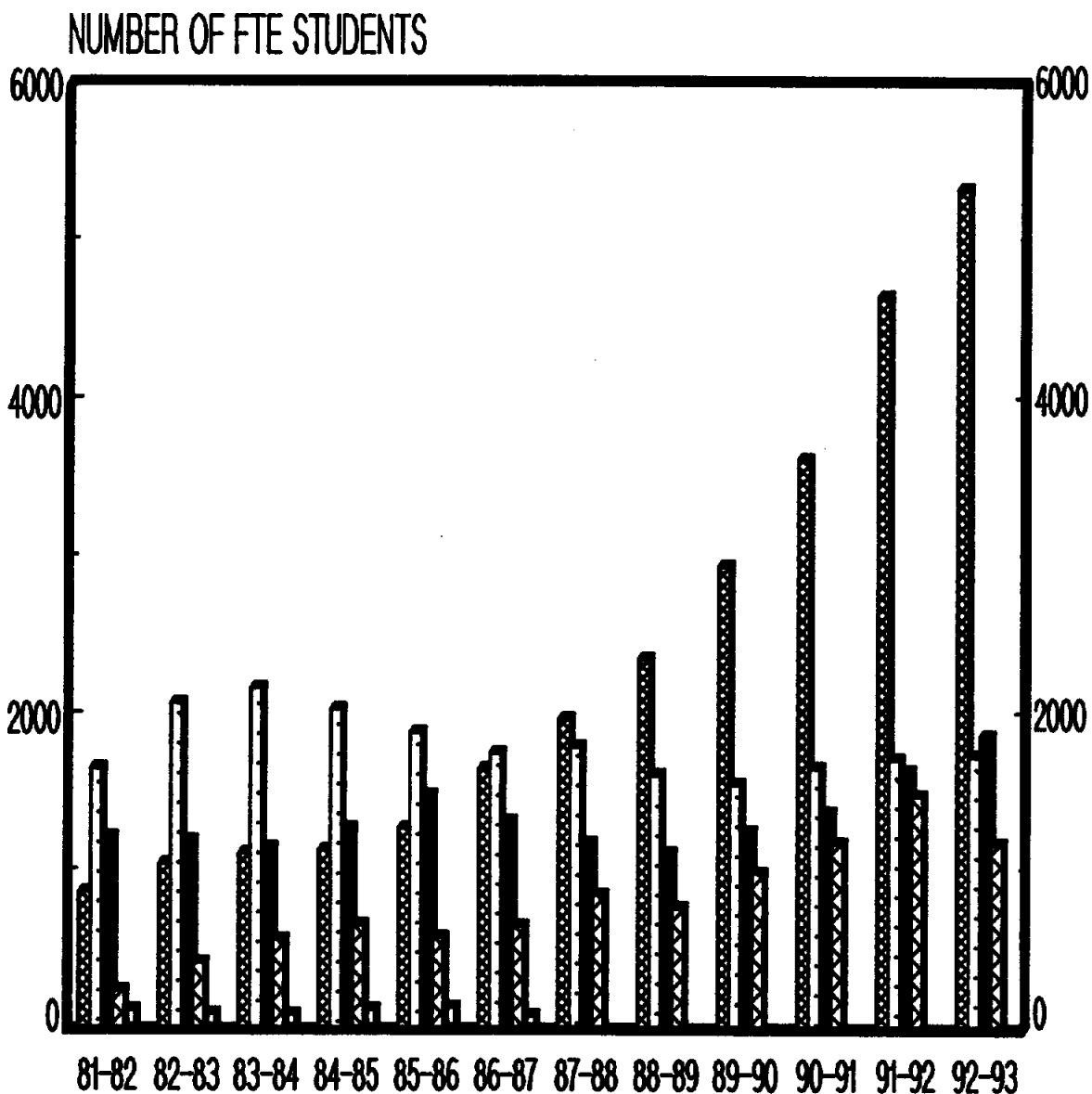

NUMBER OF FTE STUDENTS

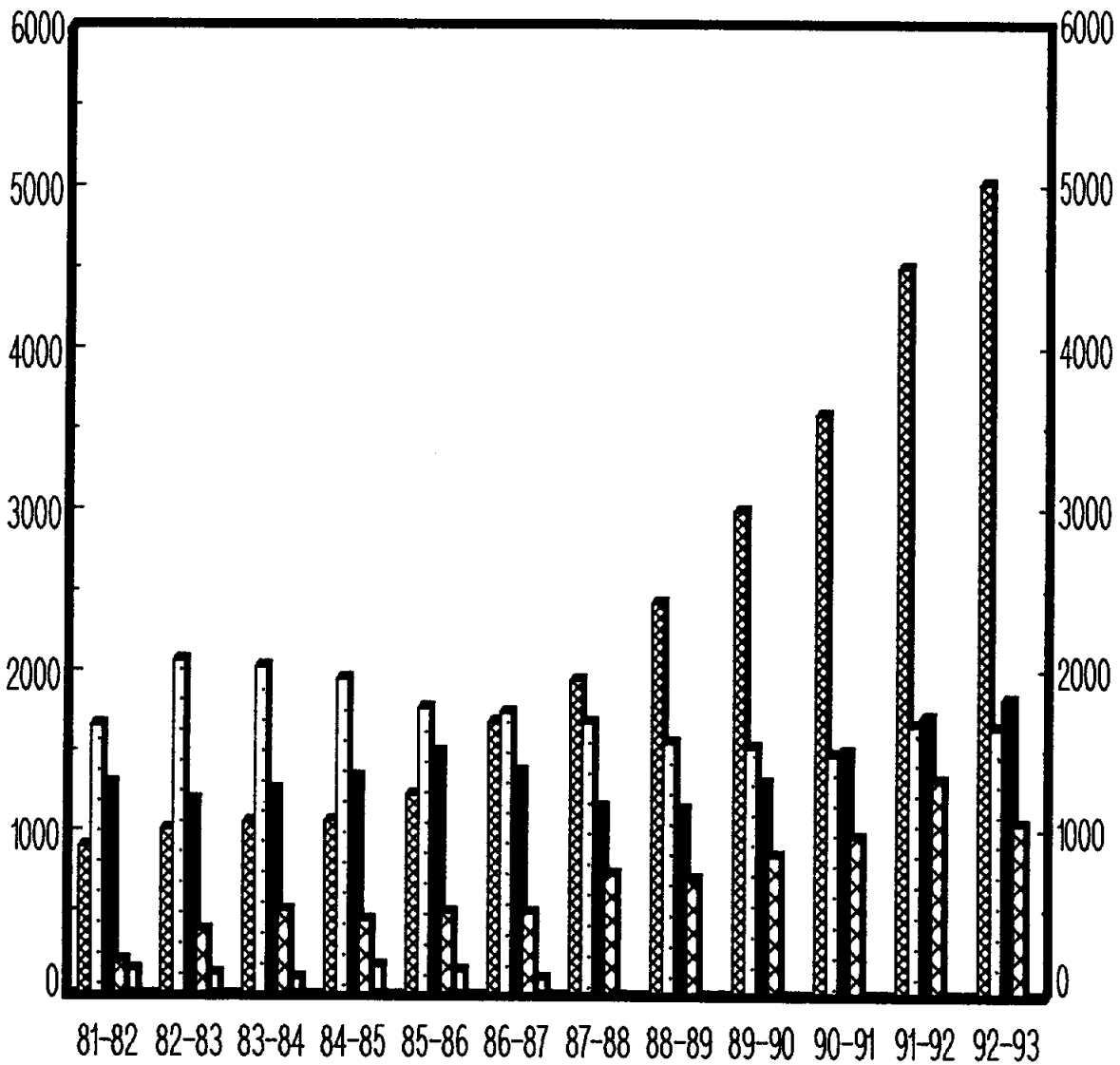

FTE ENROLLMENT BY DEPARTMENT SPRING QUARTER

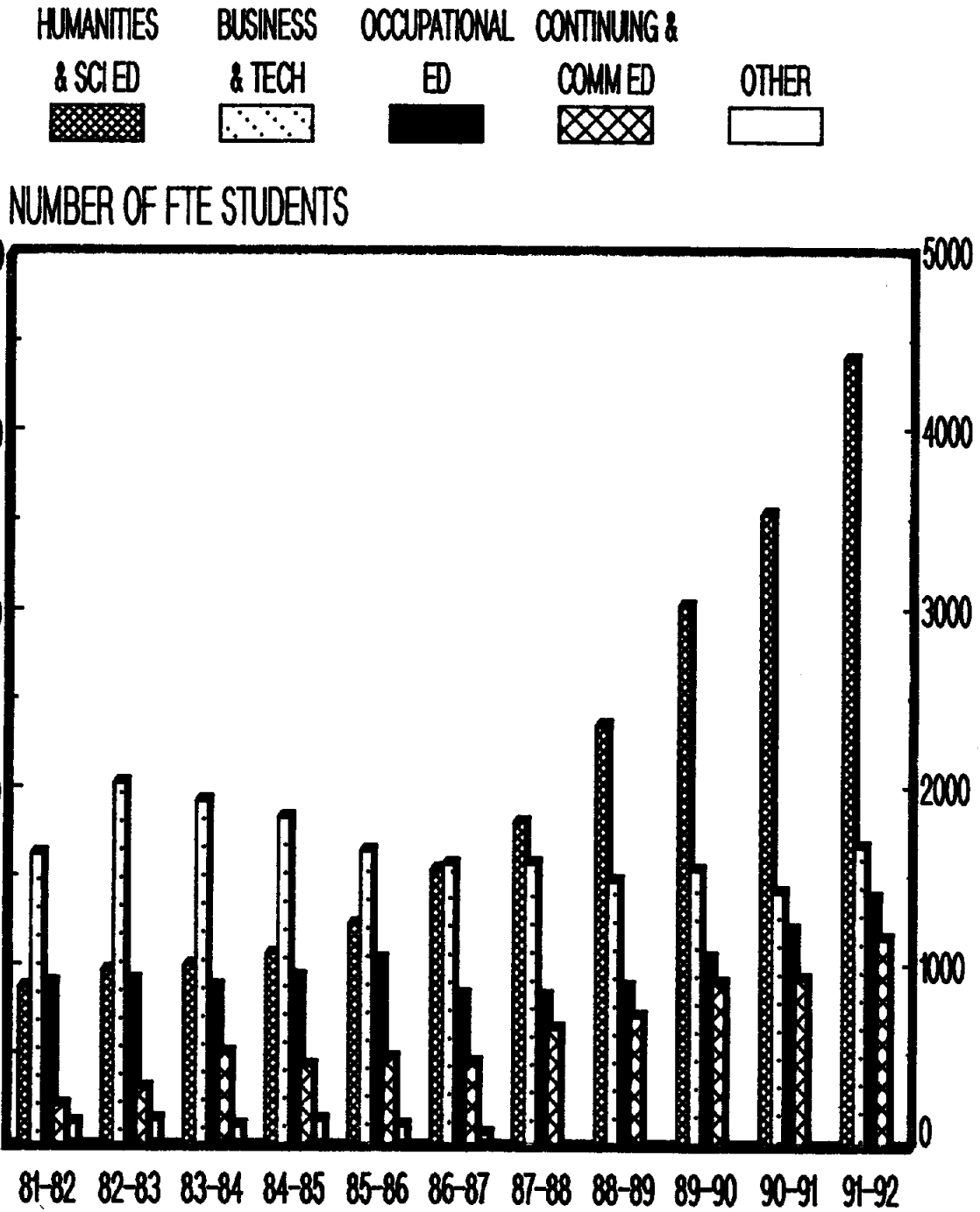

NUMBER OF FTE STUDENTS

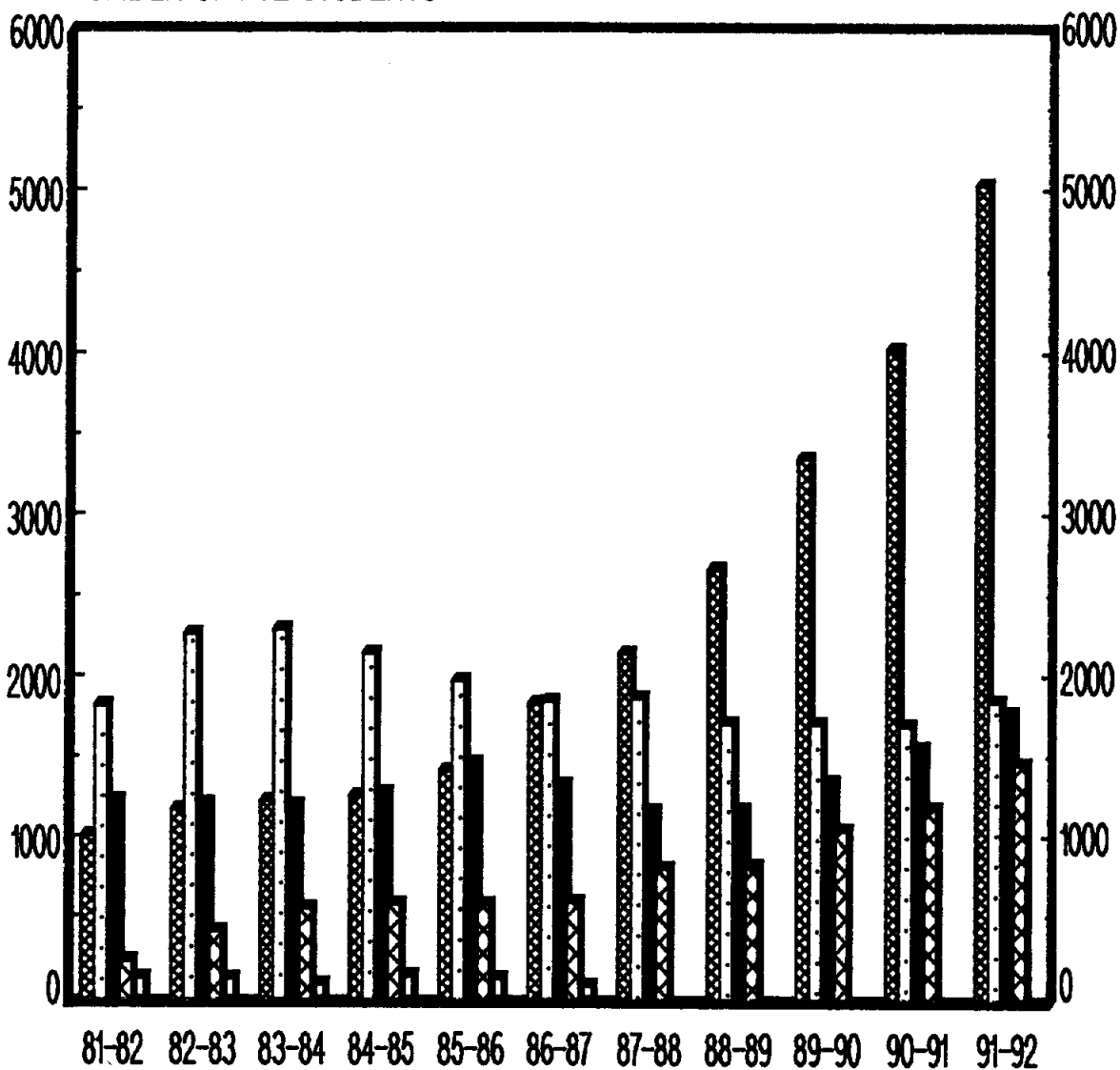

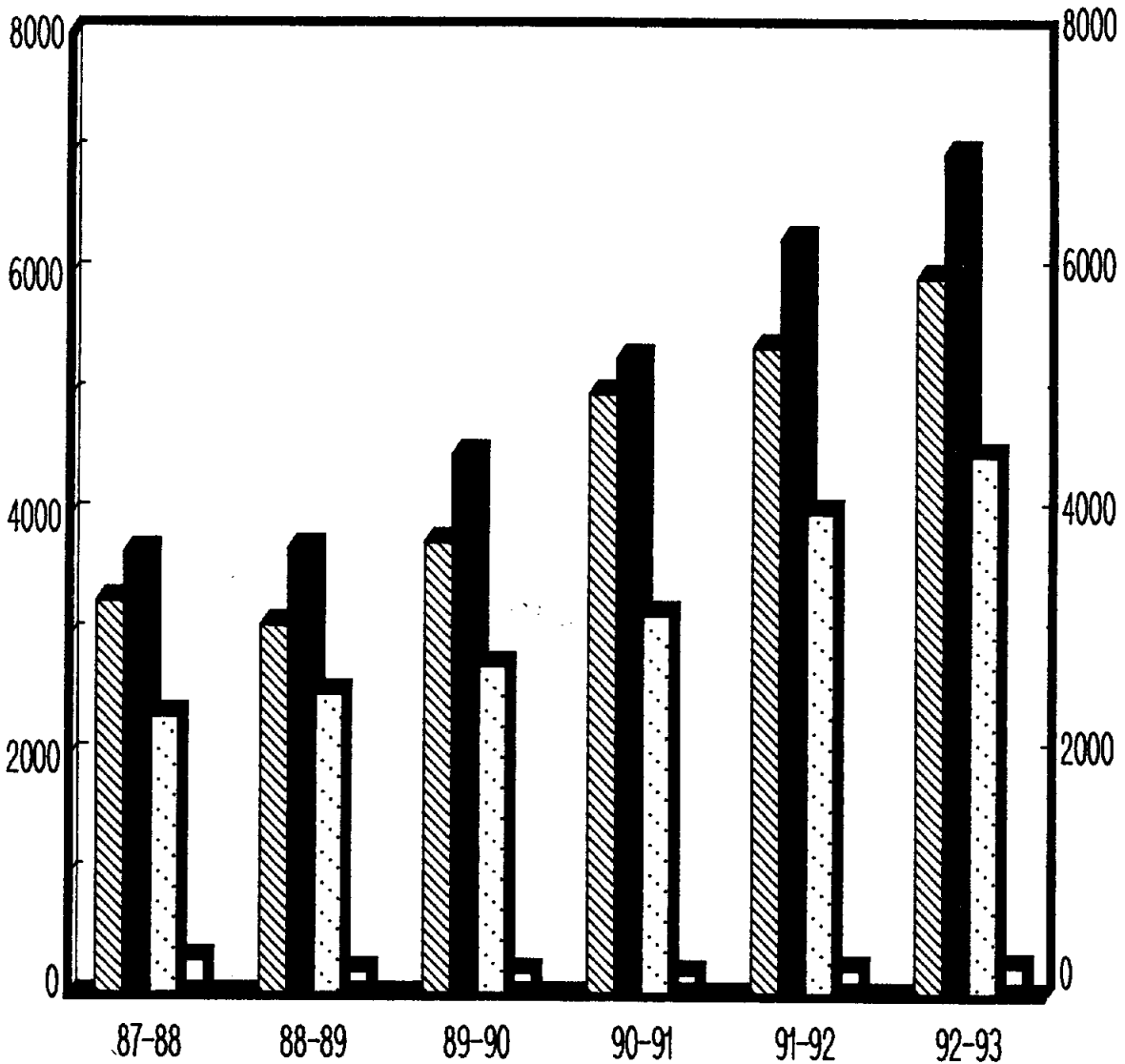

HUMANITIES & SCI ED BUSINESS & TECH OCCUPATIONAL ED CONTINUING & COMM ED OTHER

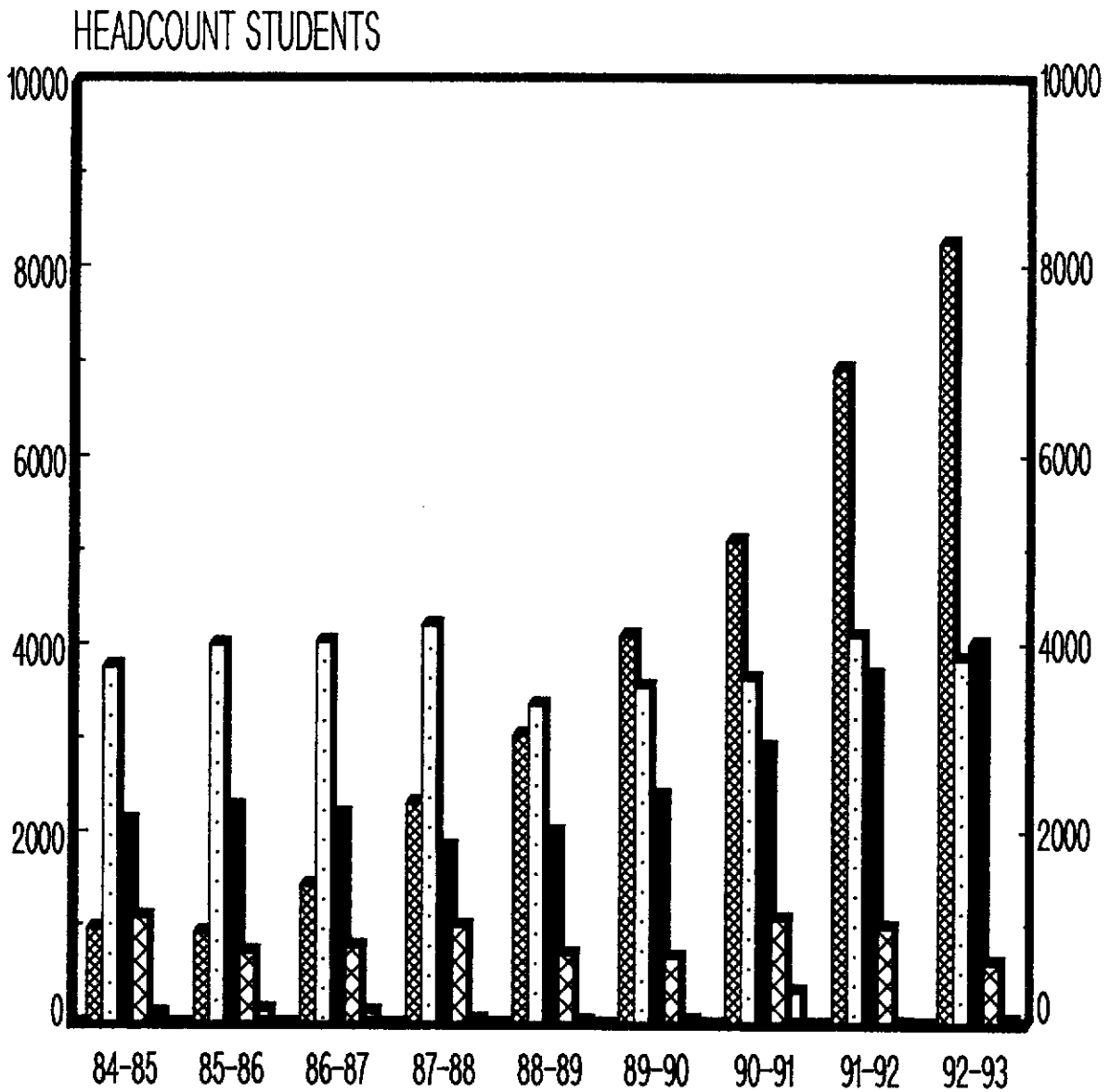

 ZIP CODES WITH 50 OR MORE STUDENTS

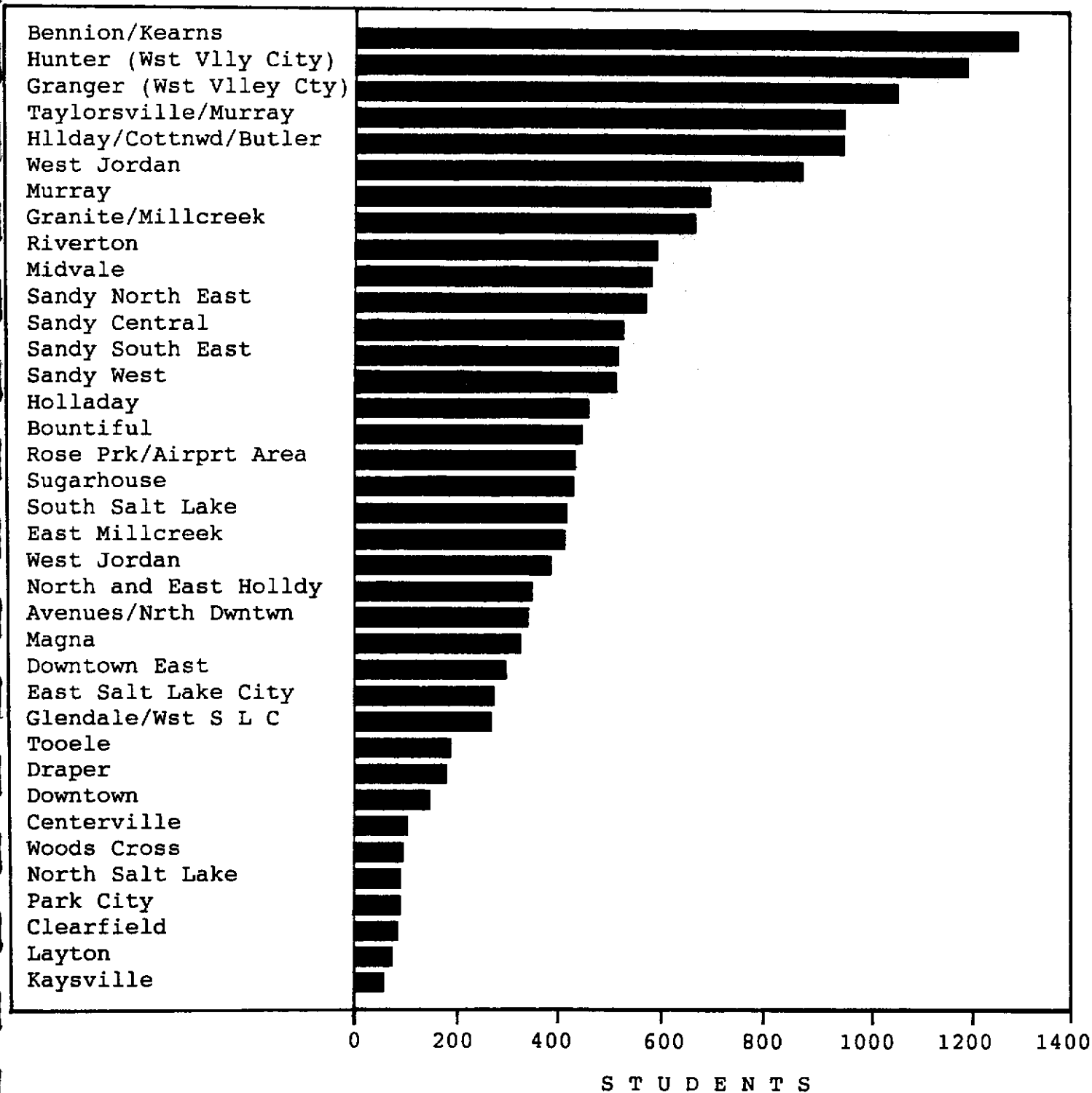

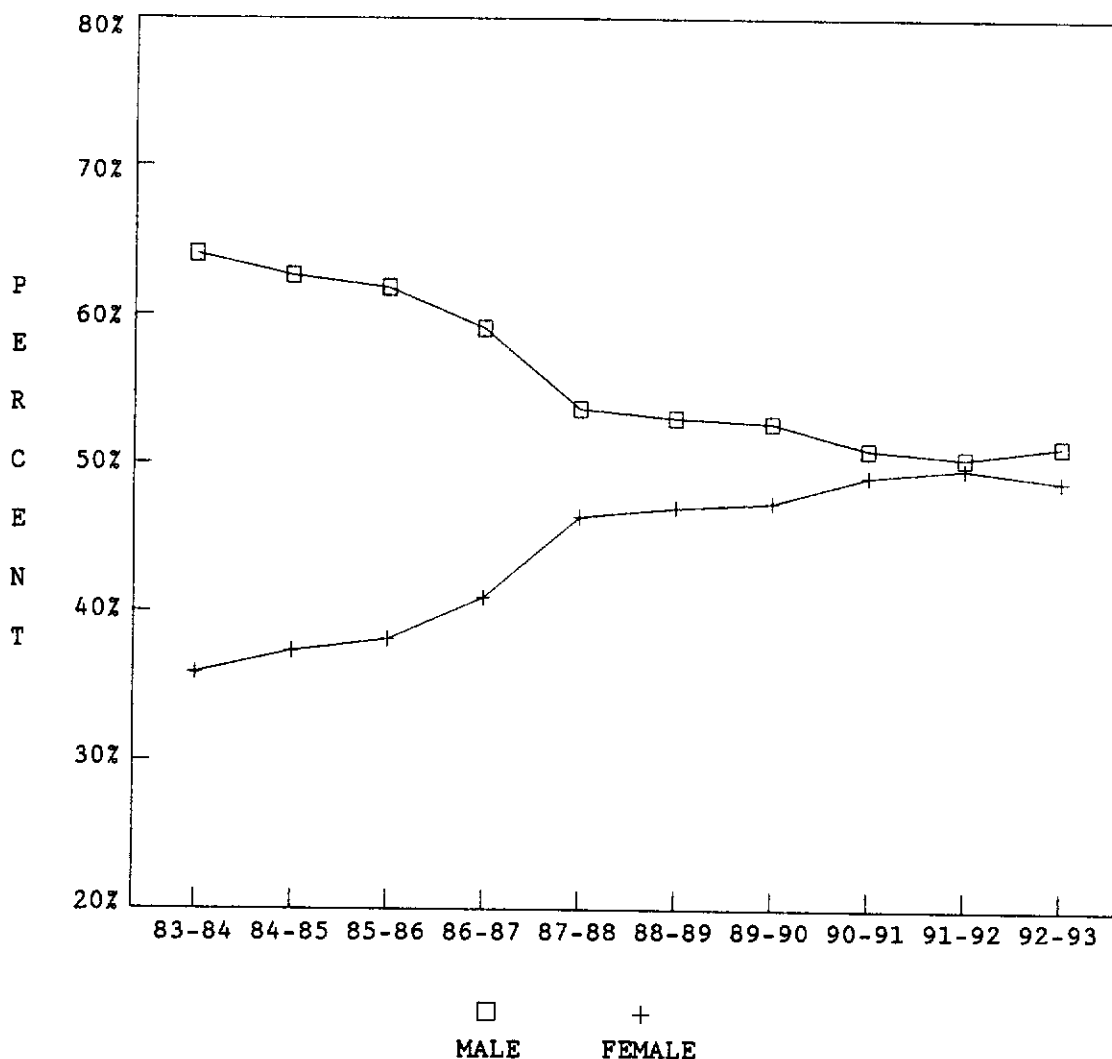

Fall Headcount

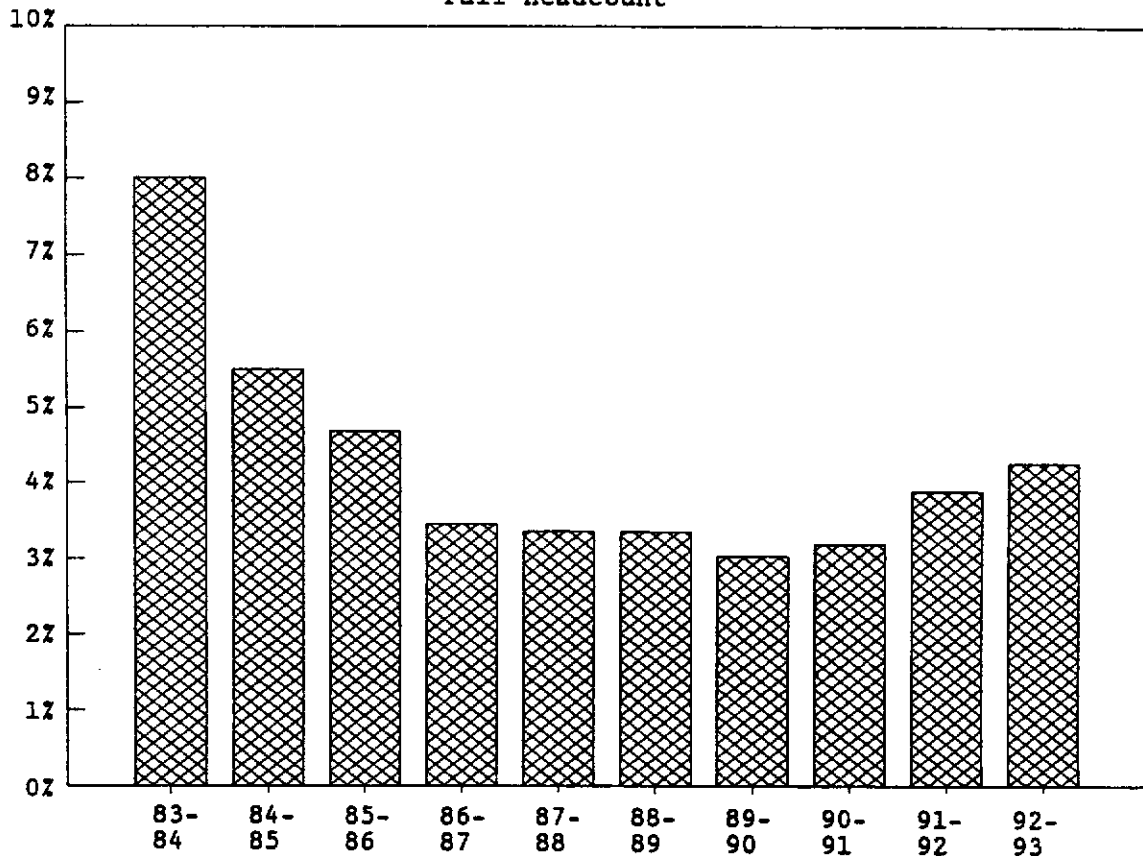

STAFF RATIOS

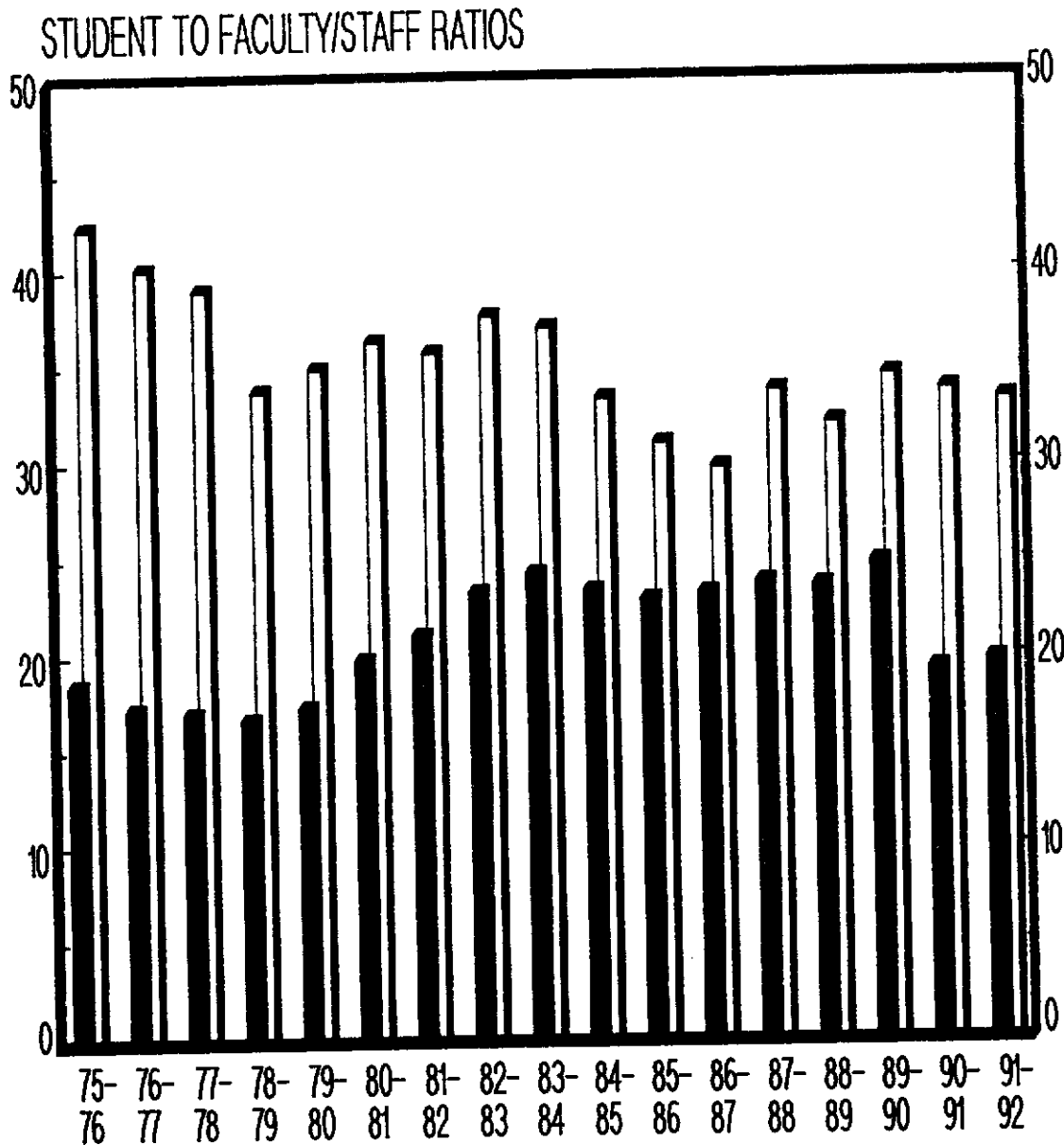

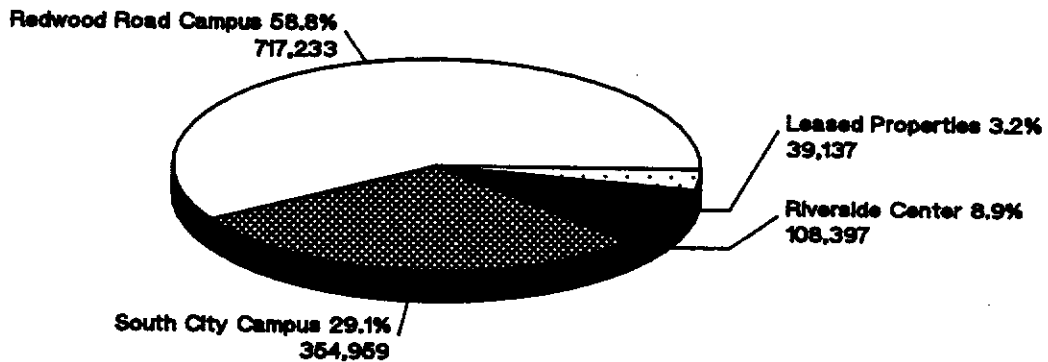

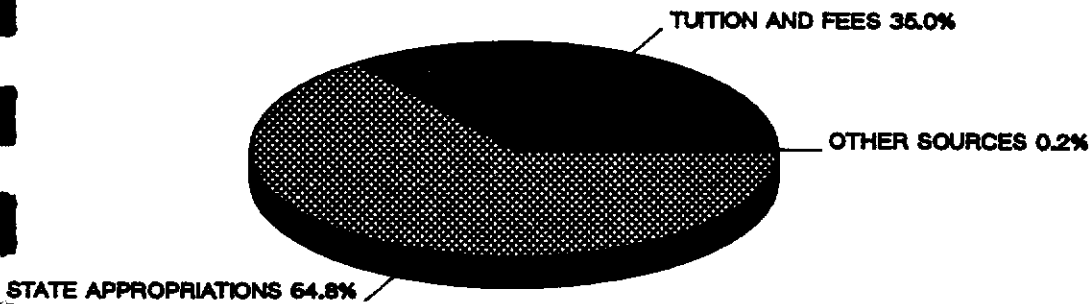

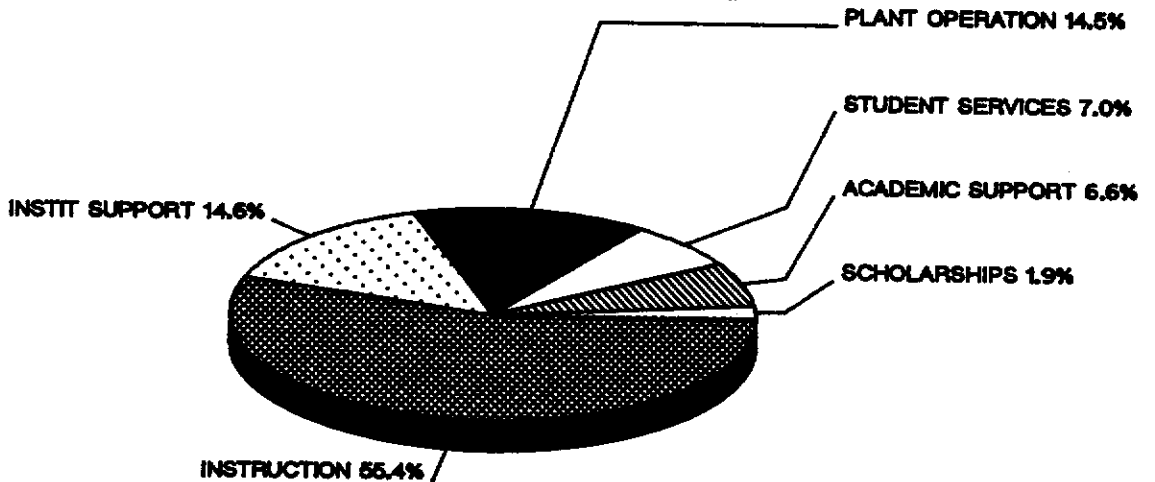

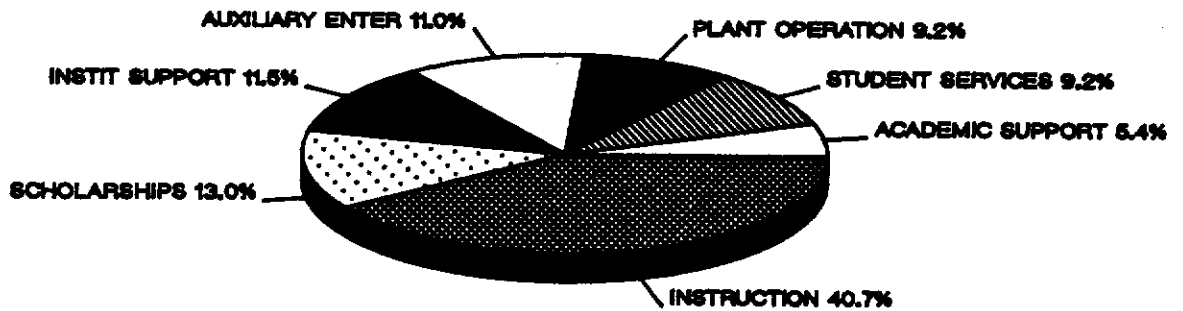
