#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT OUTLINE----

#### 1. ENVIABLE REPUTATION

- a. CASPER COLLEGE LETTER
- b. PHENOMENAL GROWTH

1969-70 the fall quarter headcount was less than 3000 THIS FALL IT WILL EXCEED 6000 PLUS OVER 300 IN THE SKILL CENTER

c. SECURITY APPLICANT -- FORMER STUDENT -- stated our business department was superiOr to the business department in the school he attended after UTC

d. SALUTE DURHAM'S COMMENTS

NO NEW SCHOOL WILL BE ESTABLISHED IN UTAH DURING THE NEXT 10 YEARS. I TAKE ISSUE, HOWEVER, WITH HIS COMMENTS THAT ENROLLMENTS WILL SHOW LITTLE GROWTH. THAT MAY WELL BE FOR THE SYSTEM AS A WHOLE BUT OUR EXPERIENCE INDICATES THAT WE WILL CONTINUE TO GROW.

c. THIS IMPOSES A TREMENDOUS RESPONSIBILITY ON EACH OF US IF WE DESIRE TO RETAIN THE REPUTATION WHICH WE ENJOY IN THE COMMUNITY.

#### 2. UTAH'S GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT

- a. FANTASTIC GROWTH PREDICTED IN THE FOSSIL FUEL AREAS -- PRINCIPALLY COAL AND OIL SHALE.
- B. UTAH'S POPULATION IS EXPECTED TO INCREASE MORE RAPIDLY THAN THE NATIONAL AVERAGE.
  - c. I THINK IT'S INEVITABLE THAT CONSIDERABLE GROWTH WILL OCCUR AND THAT IMPOSES ADDITIONAL TRAINING RESPONSIBILITIES ON THE COLLEGE.
  - d. TRAINING IN OUR ESTABLISHED AREAS WILL CAUSE NO BROBLEMS. WE CAN TRAIN MORE POEPLE IN WELDING, ELECTRICITY, REFRIGERATION, MACHINE SHOP, ETC. EVEN IF IT REQUIRES OPERATING THE COLLEGE ON A 24 HOUR BASIS. WE CAN MEET THE CHALLENGE
  - e. MY CONCERN IS ESTABLISHING TRAINING IN AREAS NOT PRESENTLY IN THE CURRICULUM. WE'VE BEEN HEARING, TALKING ABOUT AND READING ABOUT THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE TO BE TRAINED FOR THE PAST TWO YEARS. BUT NO ONE HAS EVER DEFINED THE TRAINING REQUIREMENTS.

f. ABOUT NOW SOMEBODY BETTER BE GETTING SPECIFIC. IT CAN'T BE DONE OVERNIGHT-

WE NEED LEAD TIME.

g. I GET A BIT CONCERNED IN PUBLIC MEETINGS WHEN THE GOVERNOR TALKS ABOUT THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT REQUIREMENTS, TRAINING NEEDED TO PROVIDE JOBS FOR UTAHANS AND THEN HE SINGLES ME OUT AND SAYS, JAY, THE TECHNICAL COLLEGE WILL BE EXPECTED TO TRAIN PEOPLE FOR THESE JOBS.

H. TELL US SPECIFICALLY WHAT KINDS OF JOBS AND WE'LL BE READY.

- i. I HOPE WE WON'T BE CAUGHT IN THE TRAP OF SAYING TO USES—WE TRAINED 'EM NOW YOU PLACE 'EM. THEN THEY'LL SAY \*\* YOU DIDN'T TRAIN 'EM RIGHT TO WE CAN'T PLACE 'EM.
- AND I HOPE INDUSTRY WILL LEVEL WITH US. THE MAYOR OF ROCK SPRINGS SPOKE RECENTLY TO THE USES ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CONFERENCE. AS YOU KNOW, ROCK SPRINGS AND GREENRIVER, WYOMING ARE BURSTING AT THE SEAMS. THE CITIES HAVEN'T BEEN ABLE TO ACCOMMODATE THE WORKERS—HOUSING, WATER, ELECTRICITY, SANITATION FACILITIES. THE MAYOR EXPLAINED THAT ONE OF THE MAJOR REASONS FOR THE MESS IS THAT INDUSTRY DIDN'T LEVEL WITH THE PLANNERS. INDUSTRY WOULD ANNOUNCE A NEED FOR 200 WORKERS—ABOUT THE TIME PLANS WERE UNDERWAY PREPARING FOR 200 THEY'D LEARN THAT THE INDUSTRY ALREADY HAD LOO WORKERS. THIS WOULD BE AN IMPOSSIBLE SITUATION.
- k. SOME CITIES HAVE PLACED A MORTORIUM ON HOUSING.

    THERE ARE SOME EXCELLENT ONES.
  - h. THE OBJECTIVEOF THIS EFFORT IS TEACH SPECIFIC UNITS IN HIGH SCHOOL AND THEN WHEN STUDENTS ENROLL AT THE POST HIGH SCHOOL HE WOULDN'T HAVE TO REPEAT THE INSTRUCTION.
  - i. I SALUTE THE IDEA BUT IT DOESN'T WORK IN THE MAJORITY OF INSTANCES.
  - j. WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A STUDENT COMES TO UTC FROM A HIGH SCHOOL?
  - K. STATE DEPARTMENT MUST ENFORCE THE PLAN.
  - 1. THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION HAS LAUNCHED AN EVALUATION OF HS VO-ED TRAINING AND THEY WILL UNDOUBLTDLY DISCOVER WHAT I'VE BEEN POINTING OUT.
  - m. FROM MY POINT OF VIEW THE STATE MUST ACCEPT THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR POLICING THE SYSTEM OR GET OUT OF THE BUSINESS.
  - N. HS'S TEACH AWARENESS AND AN OVERVIEW OF THE OCCUPATION AND NOT VOCATIONAL COMPETENCY.
