WE ARE HONORED TONIGHT TO HAVE WITH US ON THE STAND A DISTINGUISHED GROUP OD INDIVIDUALS--I'D LIKE TO INTRODUCE THEM AT THIS TIME. (REFER TO LIST OF PLATFORM GUESTS.)

THESE COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES OFFICIALLY COMPLETE THIRTY YEARS SINCE
THE FOUNDING OF THE COLLEGE IN 1948. CREATED BY THE UTAH STATE LEGISLATURE
AS SALT LAKE AREA VOCATIONAL SCHOOL, THE INSTITUTION EXISTED TOTALLY AT
WHAT WE NOW CALL OUR DOWNTOWN CAMPUS AT FOURTH SOUTH AND SIXTH EAST UNTIL
1967. IN 1959 THE NAME WAS CHANGED TO SALT LAKE TRADE TECHNICAL INSTITUTE,
AND IN 1967 THE SCHOOL'S TITLE WAS AGAIN CHANGED TO UTAH TECHNICAL COLLEGE
AT SALT LAKE. AT THAT TIME THE INITIAL MOVE WAS MADE TO THE MAIN CAMPUS
AT 4600 SOUTH REDWOOD ROAD.

FROM A BEGINNING ENROLLMENT IN 1948 OF LESS THAN 700 STUDENTS, WE NOW CATER TO WELL IN EXCESS OF 7,500 MEN AND WOMEN OF ALL AGES, ENGAGED IN ONE- AND TWO-YEAR PROGRAMS. WE ARE IN FACT THE FOURTH LARGEST PUBLIC POST-HIGH SCHOOL INSTITUTION IN THE STATE . . . LARGER THAN ANY OTHER TWO-YEAR COLLEGE, AND SOUTHERN UTAH STATE COLLEGE.

WHILE UTAH TECH OFFERS MANY 2-YEAR PROGRAMS TRANSFERABLE TO OTHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, THE MAIN THRUST OF THE COLLEGE IS TERMINAL, PRACTICAL "HIRE" EDUCATION . . . AND THAT'S SPELLED H-I-R-E. AND YOU STUDENTS TONIGHT CAN ATTEST TO THAT!

DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR, 1,009 STUDENTS HAVE QUALIFIED TO RECEIVE CERTIFICATES, DIPLOMAS AND DEGREES FROM UTAH TECHNICAL COLLEGE AT SALT LAKE. THIS NUMBER INCLUDES 140 STUDENTS WHO GRADUATED DURING SUMMER COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES LAST AUGUST, AND 82 STUDENTS WHO GRADUATED FROM OUR PRACTICAL NURSING PROGRAMS. THESE EXERCISES WERE HELD IN AUGUST AND MARCH.

787 STUDENTS WERE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN TONIGHT'S GRADUATION ACTIVITIES. MANY OF THESE STUDENTS COMPLETED THEIR PROGRAMS AT THE END OF THE FALL QUARTER AND MANY OTHERS COMPLETED THEIR PROGRAMS AT THE END OF THE WINTER QUARTER. THEY HAVE BEEN ON THE JOB FOR SEVERAL MONTHS AND THEY ARE WORKING THROUGHOUT THE WESTERN PORTION OF THE UNITED STATES AND WERE UNABLE TO RETURN FOR THE GRADUATION EXERCISES. 520 STUDENTS WILL RECEIVE THEIR CERTIFICATES, DIPLOMAS, AND DEGREES TONIGHT.

WE HAVE A VERY CAPABLE AND COMPETENT FACULTY AT THE COLLEGE, AND THEY ARE DEDICATED TO THEIR ASSIGNMENTS. IN THE PROCESS OF DESIGNATING AN OUTSTANDING TEACHER THIS YEAR, THE STUDENTBODY SELECTED SIX FINALISTS FOR THE HONOR WHO WERE RECOGNIZED AT THE STUDENTBODY AWARDS BANQUET. FROM THAT DISTINGUISHED GROUP, THE COMMITTEE WAS UNABLE TO REACH A CONSENSUS. CONSEQUENTLY TWO INSTRUCTORS WERE CHOSEN TO RECEIVE THE OUTSTANDING TEACHER AWARD, DAVIS BALLARD, A GENERAL EDUCATION INSTRUCTOR, AND MARGARET NELSON, A NURSING INSTRUCTOR. DAVE BALLARD AND MARGARET NELSON, WILL YOU PLEASE STAND AND BE RECOGNIZED.

TRADITIONALLY, POST SECONDARY EDUCATION HAS BEEN EXPECTED TO PERFORM TWO ROLES:

- 1. TO PRODUCE A BROADLY EDUCATED PERSON WHO UNDERSTANDS THE WORLD AND ONE'S RELATIONSHIP TO THAT WORLD, AND
- 2. TO PREPARE A PERSON FOR LIFE'S WORK BY PROVIDING A MARKETABLE SKILL.

I THINK WE WILL ALL AGREE THAT BOTH OF THESE ROLES ARE IMPORTANT.
UNIVERSITIES SEEM TO ADVOCATE THAT THEIR RESPONSIBILITY IS TO TEACH

INDIVIDUALS HOW TO THINK AND PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH A BROAD GENERAL EDUCATION. VOCATIONAL EDUCATION ADVOCATES PROVIDING SKILLED TRAINING AND ONLY THE SUPPORTIVE GENERAL EDUCATION NEEDED TO PERFORM THE TASK. PERHAPS THERE IS A NEED FOR A COMPROMISE IN BOTH AREAS.

IT'S MY OPINION THAT A MAJOR THRUST OF THE TOTAL SYSTEM OF EDUCATION SHOULD BE TO PREPARE STUDENTS FOR THEIR LIFE'S WORK. I FIRMLY BELIEVE THAT STUDENTS SHOULD BE STEERED INTO STUDIES THAT WILL LEAD TO EMPLOYMENT.

OBVIOUSLY, I DON'T THINK THIS SHOULD BE THE ONLY THRUST. WE RECOGNIZE THAT THERE IS MORE TO LIFE THAN WORK, BUT WE RECOGNIZE, TOO, THAT THERE IS NO TRULY GOOD LIFE WITHOUT A GOOD JOB.

THE UNITED STATES IS A JOB ORIENTED SOCIETY. WITHOUT A JOB, YOU'RE A NOBODY. THE WORK ETHIC HAS MADE AMERICA GREAT, AND I FEEL A STRONG COMMITMENT TO PRESERVE AND REVITALIZE IT AMONG THE YOUNGER GENERATION.

I'M CONFIDENT THAT ALL OF US WANT TO ACHIEVE SUCCESS IN OUR LIVES.

WE WANT OUR FAMILIES, OUR FRIENDS, AND RELATIVES, AND OUR BUSINESS

ASSOCIATES TO LOOK UPON US WITH PRIDE AND ADMIRE OUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS.

IT'S FUN TO COUNSEL WITH STUDENTS AND SUGGEST A FORMULA THAT WILL HELP

ASSURE THEIR SUCCESS. I USE AN EXAMPLE FROM PAUL DUNN'S BOOK, ENTITLED

ANXIOUSLY ENGAGED, HE TELLS ABOUT A RETIRED BUSINESS EXECUTIVE FRIEND

OF HIS WHO WAS ASKED THE SECRET OF HIS GREAT SUCCESS. HE REPLIED THAT

IT COULD ALL BE SUMMED UP IN THREE WORDS--"AND THEN SOME." I DISCOVERED

AT AN EARLY AGE, HE SAID, THAT MOST OF THE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN AVERAGE

PEOPLE AND TOP PEOPLE CAN BE EXPLAINED IN THOSE THREE WORDS. THE TOP

PEOPLE DO WHAT IS EXPECTED OF THEM--AND THEN SOME. THEY ARE THOUGHTFUL

AND CONSIDERATE OF OTHERS--AND THEN SOME. THEY MEET THEIR OBLIGATIONS

AND RESPONSIBILITIES FAIRLY AND SQUARELY--AND THEN SOME. THEY ARE GOOD

FRIENDS TO THEIR FRIENDS--AND THEN SOME. THEY CAN BE COUNTED ON IN AN EMERGENCY--AND THEN SOME.

AND SO IT IS WHEN YOU DO WHAT YOU'VE CONTRACTED TO DO--AND THEN SOME, THEN YOUR EMPLOYER PAYS IN FULL--AND THEN SOME.

EXCELLENT IDEA--I HOPE WE'LL ALL SUBSCRIBE TO IT.

AS AN EDUCATOR I STRONGLY ADMONISH EVERYONE TO CONTINUE THEIR EDUCATION. EDUCATION IS A LIFELONG PROCESS. BE PROUD OF WHAT YOU'RE DOING AND ATTEMPT TO EXCELL IN YOUR CRAFTSMANSHIP. SUCCESS IS ACHIEVED THROUGH PLANNING, WORK, AND DEDICATION.
