PRACTICAL NURSING

The Department of Practical Nursing opened in September 1948, under the direction of the State Board for Vocational Education and the Area Board of Control. The department is approved by the State Nursing School Accreditation Board of Review, and the National Association of Practical Nurse Education.

One year is required to complete the course in practical nursing. Training includes 50 weeks of extensive class work and clinical experience at the Salt Lake Trade Technical Institute, the L.D.S. Hospital, the Salt Lake General Hospital, and the Primary Children's Hospital.

Each student must complete 1760 hours of class work and clinical experience to qualify for a certificate. Graduates must pass the state examination to become a licensed practical nurse.

The licensed practical nurse is helping to relieve the critical nursing shortage by giving bedside nursing care in hospitals, assisting in homes, doctors' offices and clinics. Approximately 90% of our graduates are currently employed in the local hospitals.

A new class in Practical Nursing begins every six months - March and September of each year.

"A trained Practical Nurse is a person prepared by an approved educational program to share in the care of the sick, in rehabilitation and in the prevention of illness, always under the supervision of a licensed physician and/or a registered professional nurse."
