

## TRIBUTE TO FOUR TEACHERS

THE TIME HAS COME FOR US TO EXPRESS OUR ADMIRATION AND AFFECTION FOR FOUR TEACHERS WHO SHOULD BE WELL KNOWN TO MEMBERS OF THE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION.

MRS. HARRIET VIGEN (BUSINESS), EVAN JENSEN (COMMERCIAL ART), MARTIN KNUTESON (BARBERING) AND DON WELLARD (WELDING) HAVE BEEN TEACHING AT TRADE TECH SINCE THE SCHOOL WAS ESTABLISHED IN 1948. THESE FOUR PERSONS HAVE A COMBINED TOTAL OF 72 YEARS OF TEACHING AT TRADE TECH.

GUNDERSEN SERVED AS PRESIDENT OF THE TRADE TECH ALUMNI ASSOCIATION IN 1963, AND IS ACTIVE IN THE HOLLADAY-COTTONWOOD JAYCEES. THE GUNDERSEN'S HAVE THREE CHILDREN.
